Support AFL-CIO General Board's Call On Donald Trump To Resign Or Be Removed From Office

Statement issued by the Beaver-Lawrence Central Labor Council Executive Board on January 11. 2021

The Beaver-Lawrence Central Labor Council Executive Board calls on our delegates, affiliated unions and their members, and all elected officials representing the citizens of Beaver and Lawrence Counties, to support the AFL-CIO General Board's January 8th call on Donald Trump to resign or be removed from office. The call reads as follows:

"The deadly storming of the U.S. Capitol by a mob looking to overturn the results of a free and fair election, encouraged and inspired by President Donald Trump, was one of the greatest attacks on our democracy in American history. And the fact that trespassers were allowed to roam the halls of Congress without consequence is one of the latest examples of

why we must tear down the systems and abiders of white supremacy.

Trump is an affront to every union member, and a clear and present danger to our nation and our republic. He should resign or be removed from office at once, whether through impeachment or the 254th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

This is not a statement America's labor movement makes lightly. It is not driven by politics or ideology, but rather by the fundamental belief that the preservation of our democracy is essential-though never guaranteed. Hate and insurrection have no place in America.

The AFL-CIO General Board is made up of all members of the federation's Executive Council and the principal officer of each affiliated national or international union; the principal officer been scheduled. of each trade and industrial department; a repre-

sentative of each national constituency, allied retiree and young worker organizations recognized by the federation: a representative of each chartered national community affiliate: and regional representatives of the state, area and local central bodies selected by the Executive Council pursuant to a system promulgated by the council.]"

We commend the prompt calls for resignation or removal issued by large numbers of labor organizations and elected officials. We ask others representing our jurisdiction to follow their lead. Now is not the time for silence.

Editor's note: The U.S. House of Representatives approved article of impeachment against President Trump on January 13th. The vote was 232 to 197. A trial before the U.S. Senate has not vet

President's Report

*The Labor Council's December Executive Board and Membership meetings were canceled because of the continuing pandemic. It appears that our Membership meeting will continue to be canceled at least for the next few months because of restrictions on indoor meetings. The Executive Board Officers will to run in the May 18th primaries attempt to arrange virtual monthly Executive Board meetings on regularly scheduled dates and times by teleconference call.

The Pennsylvania municipal primary election will be held on May 18th. The Pennsylvania

AFL-CIO encourages union members to run for local offices. Hundreds of union members were elected to local offices in the 2019 Pennsylvania election cycle. After the general election, Secretary-Treasurer Frank Snyder stated: "We are proud of the thousand-plus union mem-

bers that ran for state and local offices in communities across our Commonwealth. There is no better way to ensure that working people are represented than through the election of cardcarrying union members. It's not enough to elect supporters of workers' rights, we must elect champions of workers' rights." Union members in Beaver and Lawrence Counties who intend should notify the Labor Council as soon as possible so that we can make their candidacies known to our members. The Labor Council has the authority to endorse candidates for local offices, but, because of the pandemic, we may not be able to arrange the necessary interviews and membership endorsement votes.

Several statewide judicial elections will also be held this vear. One seat in each of the Supreme Court, Superior Court and Commonwealth Court will be contested. Two Superior Court and three Commonwealth Court judges must stand for retention

elections. The recent efforts to judicially reverse the presidential election results with lawsuits filed in our statewide courts demonstrate the need to support labor friendly statewide judicial candidates. Candidacies for statewide offices cannot be endorsed by individual labor councils - they must be endorsed by the state AFL-CIO in accordance with its bylaws. However, individual labor council can recommend endorsement of candidates to the state AFL-CIO.

The Labor Council sends a delegation to the Martin Luther King Celebration Committee's MLK Birthday Celebration banquet each year. The banquet, and many other local MLK birthday celebrations, has been canceled this year because the Covid-19 pandemic. The AFL-CIO's Dr. Martin Luther King J. Civil and Human Rights Conference, which is held each year to mark the MLK holiday, has not been canceled. It will be held virtually on January 15-16. The theme for will be "From Protest to Power: When We Fight We

> Win." Contact your union's civil rights department it you are interested in attending.
