Tom Wagner Memorial Scholarship

Tom Wagner (1952-2010) served as President of the International Association of Machinists (IAM) Local 101, now part of IAM 1968. Shortly after becoming a delegate to the Erie-Crawford Central Labor Council, Tom served as the CLC's Corresponding Secretary. He passionately supported the Community Service Committee as a co-chair. A "kid at heart," Wagner's favorite community service activities were the annual Christmas programs for children, which included the distribution of dozens of wrapped presents. Due to his college study in communications, Wagner served capably as the editor and published of the Erie-Crawford CLC newsletter. His hours of effort to perfect the publication (including many late nights) reached well beyond the members of the CLC. Tom's skillful writing and insights helped the wider community understand the important role which labor plays in the region.

Wagner's death, after a short illness in March 2010, represented a sad loss for the Erie-Crawford CLC and the region.

Theo Sabin Meyer Memorial Scholarship

Theo Sabin Meyer (1890-1986) began her career in teaching and found success later as a union organizer. Theo founded the Erie, PA chapter of the Women's International League, which attracted the attention of leaders in the AFL-CIO. The Women's International League is the oldest active peace organization in the world. She challenged the practice of sending children to jobs instead of school. She was also a spirited and courageous speaker. It is reported that she delivered remarks to President Franklin Delano Roosevelt as he led the United States out of the Great Depression and through World War II. Meyer's 20th Century efforts to champion the rights of workers, women, and children inspires social justice reform even today.

John "David" Dever Memorial Scholarship

David Dever (1942-1981) graduated from Cathedral Prep in 1960 and attended Gannon University.

He joined Fenestra Corporation and became a member of United Steel Workers Local 3872.

Dever's photographic memory, love of debate, and commitment to labor led him to serve as a union steward. He served for 12 years as a USW 3872 President before coming a staff representative and organizer. He also served as delegate to both the Central Labor Council and Industrial Union Council, AFL-CIO. Dever encouraged community support through public service and was a member of the United Labor Leaders, a member of the Community Service Committee with his local and council organizations, and executive board member of the United Way.

He worked with the Pennsylvania State Police in Erie and Crawford Counties for 27 years, served as a National Guard Reservist for 14 years, and volunteered with the PA Public Interest Coalition. Dever's efforts were both pragmatic (he helped found the Erie Community Credit Union) and symbolic. He advocated for a labor monument to memorialize workers who were injured or killed at work. That monument would come to life as the Workers Memorial in Perry Square, but because he died at age 39, he never saw the monument dedicated. David truly *made a difference* for all of us.
